as at 1 October 2010

As the new 09/10 season got set to begin, we re-cap how the last season finished.

Scott Joblin came from nowhere last season to appear in the top-26 at the start of the 2010 calendar year, and was soon sitting at the top of the rankings on the back of some great results at major events throughout the season.

Hot on his bumper though were three former #1 ranked drivers in **Malcolm Ngatai**, **Wayne Hemi** and **Shane Penn**, with **Shane Harwood** rounding out the top 5.

NZ Champion **Brendon Higgins** remained relatively stable throughout the previous season, while **Joe Faram** had a successful return to the top level of competition to be at #7.

**Peter Rees** spent 7 weeks at #1 mid season, before dropping at the end due to some unsuccessful regional championship defences but stayed within the top-10, followed by the consistent **Andy McCabe** and **Dale Ewers**.

The season also saw the emergence of some new names into the top-26, including two that needed no introduction, **Dale Robertson** and **Craig Boote**, the former making the move up to Superstocks from Stockcars, and the latter back after many years away.

Other new names included new 2NZ **Bevan Humphrey** (another to move class), **Michel Willemsen** and **James Soane**.

13 drivers lasted the full season inside the top-26, with 13 new or returning drivers making the end of season/start of season list.

**The early part of the season can see a lot of movement depending on whether drivers make appearances on the track, but this didn't affect the top of the rankings, as Scott Joblin held #1 in an unchanged top 4.**

But it was certainly close, with **Malcolm Ngatai, Wayne Hemi** and **Shane Penn**, all on equal rankings points! The final positions based on countback meant no change in their order either.

**Peter Rees** was the first driver to start making an impression this season with a win at the West Coast Champs in Wanganui moving him up to #5, while **Murray Longs** runner-up spot saw him jump up 7 places to 18.

*This is a 'Grand Slam Update' and features adjustments taking into account the New Zealand Superstock Championships in Rotorua on December 29 and 30.*

**Dale Ewers win at the NZ's catapulted him back up the rankings, but he couldn't knock the new 2NZ Scott Joblin off the Number-1 spot at top of the kiwisuperstocks.co.nz National Rankings.**

Despite failing to qualify at last years national event in Kihikihi, Ewers maintained a spot in the Rankings top-26 through consistent results through the rest of the season, including a third place at the previous seasons Grand Prix. So a change in his points from a non-qualifying score to a first place score saw the new champion rise 10 spots to sit at #2, the same place he was a year earlier. However expect him to drop in the next update, since he won't be competing at the GP event a week later.

Sitting above him remained **Scott Joblin** who had held the #1 position since March last year. Another podium finish at this latest Grand Slam event secured a comfortable buffer at the top, while his run-off foe at the NZ's, **Peter Rees** moved up into the top-3 in the rankings, matching his new 3NZ designation.

Because the New Zealand Championships has the most rankings points available for drivers from all the seasons meetings, this event does create a fair amount of movement in the rankings, making it a crucial event to repeat previous performances to maintain rankings points. For this reason, last years 1,2 and 3 NZ's all took a tumble, with only **Brendon Higgins** remaining in the top-26.

Top-10 finishes at the event for **Mark Osborne** and **Scott Miers** moved them all back into the top 26.

### as at 3 January 2011

*This is a 'Grand Slam Update' and features adjustments taking into account the NZ Grand Prix in Wanganui on January 1 and 2 2011.*

**Two podium finishes at Grand Slam events within a week helped Peter Rees climb to the top of the kiwisuperstocks.co.nz National Rankings, a position he had last held in early March 2010.**

A second placing at the NZ Grand Prix in Wanganui following his third place at the NZ's were both improvements on last seasons results for the Palmerston North star, and gave him a slight rankings points edge over former #1 **Scott Joblin** who slipped to second in the rankings. It was still a creditable 4th in the NZGP championship for Joblin, but Rees superior overall scoring gave him the advantage.

**Wayne Hemi** bounced back from his disappointment in Rotorua, eventually winning his second GP title in 4 seasons, and moved up 8 places to #4, one behind **Dale Robertson**, another driver who had been pulling consistent results at these recent Grand Slam events.

As expected, the new New Zealand Champion **Dale Ewers** took a drop this update, after not contesting this event. Along with fellow Nelsonian **Shane Harwood**, both finished on the podium at this event a year previous, so dropped away slightly. However **Brett Nicholls** (the current South Island Champ) had done the reverse; did not attend last year, and did so this year, so increased his rankings points and moved up to #5, the highest ranked mainlander this update.

Defending NZGP Champ **Shane Penn** dropped 7 places to #11, after qualifying but suffering engine problems, while a number of drivers re-entered the top-26 amongst all the losses and gains of points.

*This is a 'Grand Slam Update' and features adjustments taking into account the World 240s in Rotorua on January 14 and 15 2011.*

**Already sitting at #1 on the Rankings, Peter Rees victory at the World 240's further cemented his position as the top driver in the land. This result meant three podium finishes at the first three Grand Slam events of the season, and a points advantage that was sure to be unequalled in the short term future.**

Like Rees, **Scott Joblin** was again at the pointy end of the field and maintained second place, while **Wayne Hemi** moved up to third, despite not appearing at the meeting, and actually losing rankings points. **Brett Nicholls** held his spot as the top South island driver, one of three in the top-10.

**Graeme Barr** jumped up 13 spots on the back of his podium finish to a career high #13, while **Joe Farams** break from racing saw him drop considerably losing the points he earned a year earlier when he finished second at this event.

*This was a 'Monthly Update' featuring adjustments taking into account various events throughout January (excluding Grand Slam events) AND also the King Country & Canterbury Championships that were run in December and missed from the January 1 update.*

**Peter Rees and Scott Joblin held their respective spots at the top of the kiwisuperstock National Rankings, but some close points totals saw a few small shuffles amongst the remainder of the drivers in the top part of the rankings this month.**

In fact, the entire top-14 were largely static, with just movements of 1 position up or down, the order of the month. **Scott Miers** made the biggest jump of the month, up 7 places to #15. The large jump can be attributed to his Grand Slam event results so far, as he is tied with three other drivers but leads the list on results countback.

*This was a 'Double Update' featuring adjustments taking into account the North Island Championship Grand Slam event, plus meetings held during February, including local meetings and also the Waikato Championships.*

**Winning another Grand Slam event while already being #1 on the National Rankings further increased the dominance of Peter Rees on this list.**

Despite sitting second overall, **Scott Joblin** was a long way behind Rees, but was himself well clear of **Dale Robertson** who moved up to #3 after another podium finish at a Grand Slam event. Likewise with **Graeme Barr** who backed up his World 240's result with a second place at the North Islands, up 7 places to #5.

**Scott Hewson** won the Waikato Champs, but despite increasing his points, remained solid at place 8 on the rankings.

**Peter Bengston** re-entered the top-26, while the emergence of some of the young rising stars continued, with **Karl Ross** and **Jack Miers** moving into the top echelon for the first time.

Defending North Island Champ **Joe Faram** lost his points and slipped out of the top-52, while **Stan Hickey** moved out of the top-26 for the first time in the six-year history of the rankings, following his retirement.

*This was a 'Double Update' featuring adjustments taking into account the South Island Championship Grand Slam event at the beginning of April, plus meetings held during March, including the Bay Of Plenty Championships.*

**A second South Island Championship title for Brendon Higgins helped him move back into the top-26 this month, but it was his North Island equivalent who remained firmly atop the kiwisuperstock National Rankings.**

**Peter Rees** won the only regional title on offer during March, the Bay Of Plenty Champs in Rotorua to continue his run of successes, and further extended his dominance of the sport. In fact the top-3 remained unchanged, while **Brett Nicholls** slipped a couple of spots to #6, after losing his South Island title, but a second placing this year helped him remain near the top.

Results at that South Island event saw small climbs for **Mark Osborne, Malcolm Ngatai** and **Shane Harwood**, with Higgins up a big 38 spots to #16, and the only different name in the top-26 from a month ago.

**Peter Rees started this season at #8 on the rankings, and after a run of form that has been one of the best inside a season, he has firmly established himself at the top of the rankings as this season comes to a close.**

The final month (and a bit) of racing saw a flurry of regional championships, all having slight effects on the final rankings chart. While Rees and **Scott Joblin** maintained places 1 and 2 respectively, **Graeme Barr** moved up to #3 after finishing second at the Manawatu Champs. **Andy McCabe** won the Hawkes Bay event and moved up to #6, leap-frogging **Brett Nicholls** who won the Nelson Champs.

**Jack Miers** continued his steady climb, picking up points at both the Manawatu and Nelson events, while **Steve Guilford** re-enters the top-26 after claiming second place at the Taranaki Champs.

13 drivers remain in the top-26 from the start of the season, with 10 drivers forcing their way in based on their results. The highest of these is Graham Barr at #3, with Mark Osborne also featuring in the top-10.
